**Preparatory activities** (if applicable):

**Activity 1: Kick-off Meeting**

**Participation:** The activity involved 12 participants, including 3 participants from the city of Brussels (**Belgium**), 1 participant from the city of Dublin (**Ireland**), 4 participants from the city of Granada (**Spain**), 1 participant from the city of Malaga (**Spain**), 2 participants from the city of Marseille (**France**) and 1 participant from the city of Verona (**Italy**).

**Location / Dates:** The activity took place **online (ZOOM)**, the days 21-22 April 2021

**Short description:** Kick-off meeting organised by coordinating partner CICODE. It counted with the participation of all project partners' representatives. This event represented a unique opportunity to define a common ground for the consortium and share expertise as well as project expectations.

**Short description:** consisted in an online public project presentation, which included a roundtable, about how migrants, especially women, have been at the forefront facing the difficulties caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Migrant women have carried out essential jobs and in this situation they are exposed to serious risks such as: labour exploitation, precarious work increase and unemployment; a greater risk of COVID-19 infection due to the difficulty of accessing to personal protective equipment in their jobs; a increase of populist anti-immigration discourses, racism and stigmatization. For all these, it is essential to analyse this reality with a gender and intersectional approach that allows identifying these inequalities, offering greater protection and support, and ensuring access to rights for migrant women.

### **EVENT 1: INTERCULTURAL DIALOGUES AND CITIZENS' DEBATES**

**Participation:** The event involved 690 citizens, including 88 participants from Italy, 257 participants from France, 78 participants from Belgium, 130 participants from Ireland, 131 participants from Spain, 1 participant from Northern Ireland, 1 participant from England, 1 participant from Albania, 2 participants from Scotland and 1 participant from Poland

**Dates:** The event took place from 20/06/2021 to 14/05/2022

#### **Activities implemented in the framework of the event 1:**

##### **Activity 1.1: Conference - Stigmatization of minorities, migrants, refugees and asylum seekers**
